

Punctuation Worksheet | Commas and clauses

When you have two complete sentences, you can use a comma and a joining word like "**and**," "**but**," "**or**," or "**so**" to connect them. For example, instead of saying, "We went shopping. Then we went to the pool," you can say, "We went shopping, and then we went to the pool."
