

Verbs worksheet | Subject-verb agreement

A **linking verb** connects the subject of a sentence to a word that describes or renames it. Unlike action verbs, linking verbs do not show action. Instead, they help describe a state of being (the cake *is* tasty). Common linking verbs include: *am, is, are, was, were, be, being, been*.
