

Reading Comprehension Worksheet | Sequencing

Sequencing means putting things in order, from first to last.

Instructions: Write the number 1, 2, 3 or 4 in the box beside what happened first, second, third or fourth. A parent or teacher can read along with the student, and help as needed.



1. What happened *first, second, third, and fourth*?

Sarah preheated the oven and mixed the cookie dough in a bowl.	
Sarah waited as the cookies baked, then took them out to cool.	
Sarah decided to bake cookies and gathered the ingredients.	
After shaping the dough into cookies, Sarah placed them in the oven.	

2. What happened *first, second, third, and fourth*?

Tom climbed over the small fence, and Billy crawled under it.	
Tom and Billy were playing soccer in their backyard.	
Billy accidentally kicked the ball past the neighbor's fence.	
They finally got their ball back, and headed back home.
