

Pronouns worksheet | Relative pronouns

Relative pronouns like *who*, *whom*, *whose*, *that*, and *which* introduce **relative clauses**. A relative clause gives extra information about a word, or idea. For example, in “The dog that barked loudly is mine,” the clause “that barked loudly” adds more details about the dog.

Instructions: Read each sentence below. Then, circle the relative pronoun, and underline the relative clause.

1. The team that won the game celebrated at the restaurant.
2. The dog who barks loudly belongs to our neighbor.
3. The movie that we saw last weekend was great.
4. The person whose picture is on the wall is my grandmother.
5. The team, which practiced all week, won the match.
6. The restaurant where we ate last night was delicious.

10. The house where I grew up is on Oak Street.
