

## Pronouns worksheet | Relative pronouns

**Relative pronouns** like *who*, *whom*, *whose*, *that*, and *which* introduce **relative clauses**. A relative clause gives extra information about a word, or idea. For example, in “The dog that barked loudly is mine,” the clause “that barked loudly” adds more details about the dog.
