

## Verbs Worksheet | Auxiliary verbs (helping verbs)

**Auxiliary verbs**, or helping verbs, support the main verb to show tense, ask questions, or express possibility. Examples include be (is, am, are), do (do, does, did), have (have, has, had), and words like will, can, must, and should that show ability or necessity.
